

**GLEN ROCK BOROUGH  
COUNCIL QUARTERLY WORKSESSION  
January 6, 2011**

**Present:** L. Cadwallader, W. Cadwallader, R. Shiles, K. Wells\*, D. Young, R. McCullough, A. Merrick, M. Pokrifka.

R. Shiles called the meeting to order at 7:15 P. M. Subjects discussed included but not limited to: GR Recreation Board, Southern Regional Police Commission, and a vacancy for LGAC, Businesses invited to meeting with York Economic Development Group, and establishing a Community Volunteer List.

M. Pokrifka provided an update regarding the terms of service for Recreation Board Members. Ordinance 205 was amended by Ordinance 318, which discusses the GR Recreation Board Bylaws. According to the Municipal Code, there is a five consecutive year limit for Recreation Board Members. Two members may be appointed by the School Board. Rec Boards must have a minimum of five members and a maximum of nine members.

The terms for Recreation Board members must be staggered. The following suggestions were discussed: five members appointed for five years each, with staggered ending terms; the majority of the members must be Borough residents; if reserving the pavilion, free for Borough residents and a charge for non-residents. Council discussed wanting to work with the Glen Rock Athletic Association (GRAA) and the GR Recreation board. Anyone interested in serving on the Recreation Board should submit their letter of interest to Borough Council. Also discussed was a possible agreement between the GRAA and the Recreation Board with signed approval from a previous Council, regarding use of the large baseball field. Council discussed requesting a copy of this agreement and asked the solicitor to contact involved parties.

For the Southern Regional Police Commission, any municipality considering to opt out must advertise a public meeting and hold the public meeting, informing the community of the decision to be made. So GRB is not able to withdraw for 2012. Southern Regional is interested in providing their services to additional municipalities.

GRB has a vacancy on the Local Government Advisory Committee, York County. Through this committee local elected officials are able to express their views on planning projects in York County. The comments then “serve as input to the policy formulation and decision-making processes of the County Planning Commission.”

Local businesses have been invited to a meeting at the GR Mill Inn on January 21, 2011, which will be discussing revitalization for GRB.

Council discussed establishing a Community Volunteer List and posting it on the Borough's website. Council discussed the difference between volunteer organizations versus Borough sanctioned Committees.

The meeting adjourned at 9:02 P. M.
