Property Maintenance in the Borough of Glen Rock

House Numbers:

In an effort to help emergency responders find you quickly, property owners must follow the International Property Maintenance Code for Premises Identification. House numbers must be visible and plainly legible from the street or road fronting the property. These numbers shall contrast in color with their background and shall be Arabic numerals or alphabet letters. Numbers shall be a minimum of 4 inches (102mm) high with a minimum stroke width of 0.5 inch (12.7mm).

Grass and Weeds:

All premises and exterior property shall be maintained free from weeds or plant growth in excess of 10 inches high. Please do not blow grass clippings onto streets or sidewalks. Grass clippings in streets create dangerous conditions for motorcycles and wash into the storm basin causing clogged pipes and drains which can lead to flooding.

Abandoned Vehicles:

The failure of a vehicle to bear a current state registration or current state inspection shall be considered abandoned, except that each property shall be allowed one vehicle for restoration or hobby purposes, provided the vehicle is stored in the rear yard area, covered or protected by a barricade or fence. Please see the Borough Code of Ordinances for complete details regarding abandoned vehicles in the Borough.

Council's Corner



Glen Rock had another very successful Arts & Brewfest again this year. A huge THANK YOU to the Arts & Brewfest Committee and all the volunteers that helped on the day of the event!! This is a great event for Glen Rock. It gives us a chance to show those from outside of the Borough what this great little town has to offer.

Great news! Glen Rock was able to secure an additional \$25,000 for the Hanover Street Community Development Block Grant. This is in addition to the \$200,000 we already have to redo the curb and sidewalk on Hanover Street in the area from Link Street to Water Street. This section should be complete by the end of September. Also, it looks like we will get another \$200,000 next year to replace the curb and sidewalk on the opposite side of Hanover Street. These grants really help spruce up Glen Rock!

Another ongoing project is the replacement of the Mill Race pipes from the Mill Race to the Mill Inn. The Borough owns the two pipes and one has collapsed and the other is hanging on by a thread. These pipes are critical in carrying storm water from Church Street and other parts of the Borough to the stream. Construction will start the first week of July.

Council is looking into live streaming our meetings. We hope this will give residents more insight into Glen Rock issues and actions. Look for additional information on our Facebook and web pages in the near future.

DISPOSING OF YARD WASTE IN WATERWAYS IS ILLEGAL

It is illegal to dispose of yard waste, such as leaves, grass clippings, brush, tree branches and organic material in or adjacent to streams.

Debris left on stream banks can be washed into stream beds during heavy rains, blocking channels and pipes, and lead to flooding.

Yard waste dumped along roadsides can block drains and pipes, causing severe flooding and damage to our streets.

Illegal dumping of yard waste in or near streams contributes to water quality degradation. As it decomposes, yard waste can deprive streams of oxygen needed for aquatic life. Fertilizers in grass clippings can cause algae blooms in streams and ponds.

Yard waste dumped along stream embankments can provide refuge for rodents, and stifle the growth of plants whose roots protect the stream bank from erosion.



Yard waste may be bagged and disposed of in your regular refuse pick up, visit pennwaste.com for more information about disposing yard waste.
